

FIS Competition Facts Ski Jumping COC



COC in Sapporo (JPN): Austrian Bastian Kaltenboeck wins third competition / Thurnbichler new overall leader 13.01.2008/hn

Bastian kaltenboeck (AUT) won today the last of three COC competitions on the HS 134 Miyanomori-Okurayama hill in Sapporo (JPN). Kaltenboeck received 286.1 points for jumps up to 128 and days longest jump to 141.5 meters. Norwegian Ole Marius Ingvaldsen finished second (282.3 points / 135 and 133.5 meters) ahead of Austrian Stefan Thurnbichler (267.1 points /' 128.5 and 131 meters)

Statements

Bastian Kaltenboeck (AUT) :

"During my second jump (141.5 meters) it felt a bit like i was standing still in the air. That was a really great feeling".

Ole Marius Ingvaldsen (NOR)

"As it is the 5th COC of my career it is a really great result for me. I'm happy.

Stefan Thurnbichler (AUT)

I'm absolutely satisfied with my places 2, 3 and 4 in the three competitions here in Sapporo".

Todays third Stefan Thurnbichler (461 points) is now in the lead in the COC overall ranking ahead of Bastian Kaltenboeck (457 points). Jakub Janda (CZE) is now on the third place (435 points) ahead of Roland Müller (AUT, 421 points).

Next COC Competitions will be held in Brotterode (GER), 19.+20.01.2008.
