Travel, Transport and Accommodation

Air Travel

Accommodation

Official Accommodation Option

As per FIS rules on accommodation and half board (breakfast and dinner), each athlete and team official will pay CHF80 per person per night. A deposit of 50% per person will be required to secure the booking, which is to be paid to Snow Sports NZ **no later than 10th August 2012**.

If this deposit is not received, no booking will be made.

Balance of payment must be made on the official arrival day by cash or credit card only. Each team will be held responsible for any damage incurred during their stay. Incidentals such as telephone, laundry, internet, etc must be paid by the teams or athletes themselves and a credit card will be required from each team when checking in.

An invoice will be sent back to you by return email indicating the amount of deposit to be paid in New Zealand dollars.

2. Bookings and deposit of 50% per person must be made with Snow Sports NZ no later than **August 10th** 2012 (NZ time), to ensure availability and to secure the booking.

Visas and Liability

Visitors from certain countries must have a visitor visa to enter New Zealand. New Zealand has a special policy for athletes, coaches, administrators, officials and support staff visiting the country to participate in sporting events. All athletes, officials and members of the National Associations who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Snow Sports NZ, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by the athletes, official or other person in conjunction with the organising or staging of the event. If you are injured in New Zealand (including whilst competing in a ski/ snowboard event), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's













accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your care – and that means paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand. You will accordingly still need to arrange your own travel and medical insurance. New Zealand's medical facilities are not free to visitors except as a result of an accident but even in the case of an accident, surcharges in private facilities will apply.
