We are delighted to invite all nations to the FIS Alpine Ski Racing Australia New Zealand Continental Cup Races, which will take place at Coronet Peak, NZ. These events are part of the third edition of the Audi quattro Winter Games New Zealand, an international biennial winter sports event based in Otago, NZ.

The 2013 edition of the Audi quattro Winter Games NZ will take place over an 11 day period from the 15th -25th August and will feature elite winter sports competitions in Alpine Skiing, Cross Country Skiing, Curling, Freeskiing and Snowboarding taking place at venues across the Otago region of New Zealand's South Island.

The FIS Alpine Ski Racing Australia New Zealand Continental Cup Races will be hosted at Coronet Peak. The nearest township from Coronet Peak is Queenstown (13km, 20 minute drive). Queenstown is also the nearest major airport.

CAPTAIN'S MEETING: Saturday 17 August 2013 at 16.00 Queenstown Memorial Hall.

COACHES WELCOME

FUNCTION: Saturday 17 August 2013 at 17.00, Venue To Be Advised.

RESCUE & MEDICAL

SERVICE: Coronet Peak Ski Patrol. There will be a doctor on site for the duration of the event. A Medical Plan is available.

RULES: Rules for Alpine Continental Cup 2012/ 2013 apply.

ENTRY: Entries to Race Secretary Julie Frazier race@coronetpeak.co.nz
All entries must be made through the racer's National Alpine Ski Racing Organisation. Entry must be made on an official FIS race entry form with separate forms for male and female competitors.

ENTRY DEADLINE: Entries close at 15.00 on Wednesday 14th August 2013. Entries with quota requests MUST be made no later than 15.00 on Thursday 8th August 2013.

ENTRY FEES: \$60 per event for ANC Slalom and GS races.

ELIGIBILITY: Refer to Continental Cup Rules 2012/13 Section B Rule ANC 2.3.

Higher Quotas for ANC Nations: Australia may enter up to 30 competitors (30 men and ladies). New Zealand as the organising nation may enter 50 competitors; in addition they are entitled to any of the 30 places Australia does not fill. Competitors from Australia, New Zealand and the African Continent can compete even if they do not have FIS points but they must have a FIS code. See rules ANC.2.3.1 and 2.3.4

FIS Quotas for Visiting Nations: New Zealand has the right to allow a nation from other regions up to double their normal FIS quota provided that all competitors appear on the valid FIS list and have a maximum of 140 FIS points in SL and GS and 160 FIS points in SG qualifying through DH, SG or GS. See rule ANC 2.3.3.

National Federations applying for quota requests must apply in writing, accompanying the official entry form at least ten days prior to the competition. The Organising Committee will make a decision regarding quotas five days prior to the competition.

LIFT TICKETS: Lift tickets will be free for competitors on the days they are racing and for coaches of competitors with 1 ticket per 8 same team athletes or part thereof and 50% charge of a

day pass for remaining coaches. These complimentary lift tickets will be issued at the beginning of the Team Captain's Meeting for each race.

BIB DEPOSITS: NZ\$100 per team to be paid at the 1st Team Captains Meeting, cash only.

OPENING CEREMONY: Thursday 15th August 2013, Queenstown. Details to be advised.

CLOSING CEREMONY: Sunday 25th August 2013, Wanaka. Details to be advised.

FLOWER CEREMONY: In the finish area immediately following each race.

PRIZE GIVING: All Awards and Medal Ceremonies will take place at 6pm on the day of the race in the Queenstown Hub on Earnslaw Park, 78 Beach Street, Queenstown. Podium winners must attend the prize givings.

INSURANCE: All athletes, officials and members of the National Associations who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Winter Games NZ, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by the athletes, official or other person in conjunction with the organising or staging of the event. Public Liability Insurance (CHF) 3 million, for the period of the event, is in place. If you are injured in New Zealand (including whilst competing in a ski race), you may need the assistance of the Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC), New Zealand's accident compensation scheme. ACC helps pay for your care – and that means paying towards the cost of your treatment and helping your recovery while you remain in New Zealand. ACC will not cover any medical or related costs arising from the accident after you leave New Zealand. You will accordingly still need to arrange your own travel and medical insurance. New Zealand's medical facilities are not free to visitors except as a result of an accident but even in the case of an accident, surcharges in private facilities will apply.
