Considerations for amendments and alternative criteria by the moguls advisory panel - Course Length and Dimensions

- The gradient of the slope at Montana is 18 degrees, with the landing area of the jumps being around 21 degrees.
- The length of the course will be 120m with a track width of 13m and jump that will be a typical mogul height and construction.
- The successful Freestyle mogul competition, have been held over the past 4 years without incident or safety issues. (65 athletes)
- Proposal is to do the new Mogul format, Moguls and at the end the Jump.
