







# FIS Race - SKI SLOPE STYLE - Val Thorens- FRANCE 10-14 January 2016

O'Consulting Organisation and the French Ski Federation are pleased to invite all freestyle nations to attend a FIS Freestyle Slope Style race to be held at Val Thorens on January 10-14<sup>th</sup> 2016.

In order to help you with the preparation of your team's visit, you will find following all the information regarding the competition. ATTENTION: because of High level competition, the entries are limited.

We ask each national ski association to fill the enclosed entry form and send it back as soon as possible. The OC will confirm or not entries.

This competition is also an AFP "Gold level" sanctioned.

#### Rules

- The French freestyle Association and Val Thorens are organising an international FIS Race.
- The competition will be held under FIS rules and regulation for freestyle skiing.
- This competition is Ski Slope Style events for both men and women
- The organizing committee reserve the right to change the schedule depending on snow conditions, weather or the decision of the competition jury.

#### 2. Entries / Nation Quota and Competition Format

Entries will be accepted from the National ski Associations ONLY in accordance with the FIS.

Entries must be sent to the Organizing Committee before Wednesday December 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 included for the first list and Before Monday January 4<sup>th</sup> 2016 included for the final list (if a NSA have some extra spots available).

This FIS Race will be running in the same time of the SFR Tour race.

Competition format for MEN: Qualifications on <u>Wednersday January 13th,</u> 2 runs per competitor. Best run count. Final on <u>Thursday January 14th</u>, 2 runs per competitor. Best run count.

**Competition format for WOMEN** (max 16 participants): Competition on <u>Thursday January 14th,</u> 2 runs per competitor. Best run count.

#### **Limitation of entries:**

**For Men**: a maximum of 80 participants (40 Frenchs + 40 foreigners).

For Women: a maximum of 16 participants (8 invited riders Frenchs and foreigners + 8 foreigners).

French NSA will be responsible of its citizen entries.

The OC with the TD will select the 40 Men and 8 Women foreigners from three ways:

maximum NAMED SPOTS (20 spots for MEN and 8 spots for WOMEN): According to best results, every good level foreigner MEN skier who want to compete have to ask for his named spot to the link bellow before Monday December 28<sup>th</sup> 2015 included. The Organisation Committee and TD will valid quickly some skiers. Those confirmed skiers will have a named spot and they will have to inform and ask to their NSA to enter them. If a rider can't figure in this list of 20 top riders, this rider have to ask to his National Ski Association (NSA), one of its 2 free spots (basic quota) for MEN and the 1 free spot for WOMEN or ask to be on the Waiting list.

**EXECUTE:** INSA basic quota (around 20 spots for MEN & around 8 spots for WOMEN): Each NSA has 2 free quota for MEN and 1 free quota for WOMEN which can be added to the first list of Invited Riders. Each NSA has to ask by email to <a href="mailto:Sophie.debillon@oconsulting.fr">Sophie.debillon@oconsulting.fr</a> this free quota before Wednesday December 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 included. If a NSA wants more spots, it can ask to put some names on the Waiting List.

NSA has to send the First Entry List (included Invited riders + basic quotas) to the Organizing Committee before Wednesday December 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 included.

**waiting List**: If the 40 spots for MEN and 8 spots for WOMEN on **Wednesday December 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 included** are not completed. The available spots will be redistributed **on Thursday December 31<sup>st</sup>** to skiers and NSAs by the OC and the TD by the best and fairest way.

#### Resume:

- **Before Monday December 28<sup>th</sup> 2015 included**: Each riders ask for a named spot (can be done by NSA as well).
- **Before Wednesday December 30<sup>th</sup> 2015 included**: NSA first entry list (included invited riders + NSA free spots).
- **a On Thursday December 31st**: The Organisation Committee give the extra spots available to the waiting list.
- **Before Monday January 4<sup>th</sup> 2016 included**: NSA final entry list (only if some riders are added from the waiting list)

#### 6. Bibs and Helmets

All competitors must wear bibs and helmets during official training, competitions and award ceremony (bib only). Sanction will be given to any competitor who does not wear his/her bib.

Each Team leader will be asked a deposit of 15 € per bib. Amount will be refunded at the end of the competitions when bibs will be returned.

#### 7. Liability

All Athletes, officials and other members of their National Association who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. The Organizing committee, Val Thorens, the French Freestyle Ski Association, sponsors and suppliers, employees and volunteers shall not be held responsible to any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by any athlete, official or other person in conjunction with the organisation or staging of the event.
