On behalf of the organizing committee, we are pleased to invite your Nation to the 2018 Toyota U.S. Grand Prix - FIS World Cup Snowboard Halfpipe and Slopestyle in Snowmass, Colorado.

Entering its 22nd season, the 2018 Toyota U.S. Grand Prix traditionally brings together the world's best competitive snowboarders. The series began in 1995 and is the US Ski and Snowboard's longest-running domestic series. A new addition to the Toyota U.S. Grand Prix's resort lineup this season is Aspen Snowmass, Jan. 10-14. Snowmass, which is celebrating its 50th anniversary this season, is home to an award-winning park and pipe set up.

The Toyota U.S. Grand Prix at Snowmass is sanctioned as a FIS World Cup and WST International Level event. Athletes must meet minimum criteria for invitation to participate in the 2018 Toyota U.S. Grand Prix - FIS World Cup.

1. REGISTRATION - ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted from National Snowboard Associations following FIS World Cup quotas and rules. Please submit the provisional entry with anticipated number of your competition team (including competitors and officials) **by December 1, 2017**. The final entry with number of your competition team and names of participants (including competitors and officials) must be submitted to the organizers *no later than December 31, 2017*.

FIS has established nation Quotas for World Cup events. National Snowboard Teams can only enter World Cup Snowboard Competitions according to the Quota limitations. The Quotas can be downloaded through the following link: [FIS World Cup Quotas](#)



2. ACCOMMODATIONS

Accommodation will be provided at a variety of hotel properties located in the Carbondale (Days Inn, Comfort Inn) and Basalt (Element) areas, located between 21-28 miles from Event Registration in the Snowmass Village. Room rates will be provided based on FIS WC Quotas at 50 CHF per person, which includes a complimentary extended continental breakfast. Allocation of rooms at each property will be based on the order in which Nation's entries are received. All fees will be collected upon arrival at onsite Event Registration, located at the Base Village Conference Center (110 Carriage Way, Snowmass Village, CO 81615). Teams will be required to provide a credit card directly to the hotel upon check-in for incidentals.

Teams must submit their expected total number of team members (competitors, coaches, and team officials) and accommodations needs through the FIS entry system ***no later than Dec. 1, 2017.***

*After Dec. 1, 2017, any additional requests will be based on availability and not guaranteed at 50 CHF.

3. TRANSPORTATION/PARKING

Parking will be provided in designated parking areas at Snowmass throughout the event. Teams should inquire about parking at onsite registration.

4. ONSITE REGISTRATION/ACCREDITATION

Registration and Accreditation will be held in the Base Village Conference Center (110 Carriage Way, Snowmass Village, CO 81615). All competition participants (including competitors and officials) must report to the Registration Area for check-in before proceeding to the competition venues. All participation fees will be collected upon check-in.

5. BIBS

All competitors must wear bibs appropriately during all scheduled trainings, competition and at the awards ceremony. Training bibs will be distributed during accreditation registration. All finalist bibs will be handed out during the bib draw at the Team Captain's Meeting generally held the night prior to finals.

8. AWARD CEREMONIES

An award ceremonies will be held immediately following finals in the Venue Finish Areas. There will also be a mandatory evening award presentation following each event finals in the Snowmass Village Base Area.

To receive prize money, all competitors must attend and wear bibs during all award ceremonies.

9. PRIZES

A total prize purse of 50,000 CHF will be awarded for each Halfpipe and Slopestyle FIS World Cup events. Prize money will be awarded to the top 10 men and top 10 women. The winners will receive prize money via bank transfer. In order to process the prize money, all winners must provide valid bank details, identification, and complete appropriate tax documentation (see link below). To claim prize money, athletes must go to Registration, located in Base Village Conference Center, immediately following awards on finals day.
