# COVID-19 PROTOCOL Last updated: 21.12.2020 (subject to change) FOR TEAMS

### **FOREWORD**

DEAR TEAM MEMBERS! As Organizers Kitzbühel Ski Club, we ask you for your support during the 81st Hahnenkamm Races in the pandemic winter of 2020/21. Observance and compliance with this protocol is prerequisite for official facilitation of the races. THANK YOU – HKR OC.

NOTE: From Dec. 26<sup>th</sup>-Jan. 17<sup>th</sup> a third pandemic lockdown is announced for Austria, with a transition period until Jan. 24<sup>th</sup>. Written details valid for the 81. HKR raceweek are in the decision-making process. This protocol is subject to change – also in short term notice.

### C19 ORIENTATED ORGANIZATIONAL CHANGES FOR THE 2021 RACES

- NO SPECTATORS ON SITE: Kitzbühel region expects a restricted everyday life for locals and guests in January 2021. Unfortunately, the pandemic situation prevents the usual access of spectators to the event area (Start Area, Parallel Streif public course, Finish Area) during training and races this year.
- SPORT PROGRAMME: To support the shared objective of preventing additional infection risks, there will be no fringe sporting events (European Cup, Junior Race) and no side events (public bib draw and prize-giving ceremonies, official receptions). As the HKR are both speed and tech events, our aim is to ensure these two groups do not mix for their own safety (different regional locations of accommodation, different car parks and ski lifts).
- INFRASTRUCTURE: Organization and infrastructure on the racecourses including Start and Finish Areas, as well as TV production of the event, is planned to the usual high Kitzbühel standards. Due to the high financial risks and limited income, the organization and infrastructure for the external event area will be reduced to a minimum (no large grandstand, no VIP marquee, fewer video walls, etc.).
- OFFICES: Race Office operations will be reduced and only used by Teams and the Organizing Committee. Team Captain Meetings held online. The number of media representatives must be greatly reduced to adapt to the necessary working distances available in the Press Centre.

### C19 NEGATIVE TEST - DOCUMENTS BEFORE ARRIVAL AND ACCREDITATION

Presentation of a max. 72h old officially recognized negative PCR test result for the respective team member before accreditation is prerequisite for the <u>TEAM group (athletes, trainers, supervisors, service people and SRS, FIS officials, FIS service providers Swiss-Timing and FISMAG / Infront)</u> to receive accreditation. In detail, max 72h between testing and pickup of the accreditation.

- Detailed necessary information:must include date and time of when the test was taken
- must include name, address, homepage and email of the testing laboratory
- documented in one of the three FIS recognised languages of German, English or French
- online registration in the Covid-19-FIS-Passport!

Persons who present a positive PCR test aged between 3 months and 2 weeks before arrival do need a new PCR test for accreditation, not older then 72h. If this test is still positive, accreditation is possible in that special case, if the Ct value is >30. No accreditation for persons with a positive PCR test within the last two weeks before arrival. A positive antibody test will not be accepted generally.

In the event of COVID-19 symptoms before or on arrival, do not travel to the event venue. Teams are themselves responsible for the method of arrival and appropriate infection prevention policies upon arrival.

Places and countries visited over the past 14 days and the pre-event health questionnaire must also be correctly filled out in the Covid-19-FIS-Passport. Only if the aforementioned documents in the FIS passport have been validated, will accreditations be handed over to the Team Captain, or an authorised person in the Race Office. Upload of the PCR test at least 12h before accreditation.

By registering for the event, the team and thus its members registered on the official team entry list confirm and accept the Organizers' C19 Protocols as well as all related regulations of the Austrian government and local health authorities. In particular, they acknowledge the risk of contracting a Covid-19 infection during their stay and the associated substantial effects this may have on their physical health.

Due to the special circumstances caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, the Organizing Committee is obliged to limit the number of accredited persons. Therefore, only team officials will be granted access to the event site according to the quota World Cup Rules 4.2 and 4.3. Additional federation officials and guests outside thesequotas will not receive accreditation.

### C19 – FOLLWO UP TEST

A follow up test on site (antigen or PCR) is required on the 6<sup>th</sup> day after the initial test before arrival. The test result has to be uploaded on FIS passport. Please inform Organizers Covid-19 Coordinator about the intended technical details of this follow up test by the racing team in time.

Follow up tests are possible during raceweek from 08.00 – 16.00 h at the rescue centre below the finish area, but only on advance booking (+43 664 173 4419, <a href="mailto:covid-19@hahnenkamm.com">covid-19@hahnenkamm.com</a>). On special request tests are possible at other times.

### C19 TEST - SYMPTOMS ON SITE

Austrian C19 Protection Regulations require team members to submit a daily health questionnaire before each training and competition. This must be entered in the FIS passport.





- MOST COMMON SYMPTOMS: High temperature, dry cough, unusual tiredness, loss of sense
  of taste or smell
- CASE-WISE SYMPTOMS: headache, aching limbs, sore throat, diarrhoea
- SEVERE SYMPTOMS: difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, pain or feeling of pressure in the chest area, loss of speech or movement.

If a team member feels unwell and shows COVID-19 symptoms on site, contact the organiser's Covid-19 coordinator immediately for an antigen test (mandatory). (+43 664-173 4419). The affected person must go into self-isolation and wear a FFP2 mask. An immediate antigen test and an isolation room is available during the day at the medical operations centre below the Finish Area. Emergency testing is also possible for cases during the night.

In the event of an immediate antigen test proving negative, medical checks must be carried out with the Team Doctor and a decision on further event-related activities made and conveyed to the Organizer's Covid-19 coordinator.

In case of an immediate antigen test proving positive, self-isolation must be maintained and a FFP2 mask worn at all times. A PCR test with results within 8 hours will be organised. If the second test is also positive, the information will be passed on to the official health authorities and FIS, based on the various protocols. The respective Team Captain assures his support to the Organizer and the authorities for contact tracing and will provide appropriate lists of names and contacts.

In each team hotel, a room is reserved for a possible quarantine (max. 10 days).

C-19 APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOUR ON SITE (see overview in attachment)

**CONTACT TRACING:** All officially accredited event attendees are strongly recommended to activate the official Austrian "STOP CORONA" App on their mobile phones during their event-related stay. This enables potential contact with infected persons to be established and facilitates consequential protective measures.



CONTACT CATEGORIES Due to Austrian national regulations anyone who is a Category 1 contact person is officially obliged to quarantine for 10 days. C1 persons include all those who have had the following types of contact with a positively confirmed case within the past 48 hours:

- Those who have been in direct contact or in the same room with a positive person at a distance of less than 2 m for a total of more than 15 minutes (regardless of whether indoors or outdoors).
- Those who have had direct physical contact with an infectious person (shaking hands, hugs) or who had direct contact with secretions from a confirmed case (coughing, spitting).
- Those who have a high probability of being exposed to a particle aerosol transmission regardless of the distance (loud partying together, indoor sports, singing together).
- Those who have sat next to an infected person for a certain period of time in an aeroplane, train, coach or car.
- Those living in the same household as an infected person.





The following circumstances are assessed as <u>Contact Group 2</u> and do not automatically have to lead to mandatory quarantine but can be subject to other official measures (partial self-isolation, health diary, PCR test, etc.).

- When encountering an infected person, both parties were wearing close-fitting mouth and nose protection (applies to indoor and outdoor use).
- Those who had a shorter face to face contact time than 15 minutes with a confirmed case in the same room closer than 2 metres.
- Those who were over two metres away in the same room as an infected person, but for a longer period than 15 minutes.
- Those who travelled in the same plane, train, coach or car as an infected person for a longer period of time, but not in the same row of seats.

In general, stay in small groups within the team so in the event of a positive contact person, the whole team is not put at risk of participating in the competition.

Based on current national regulations and requirements of the Organizer, further compulsory behaviour includes:

### **DISTANCING:**

- Always maintain a distance of at least 1 metre between yourself and others.
- Maintain distances of > 2 m to others, to avoid being classified as Contact Person 1 when in longer contact with infected persons (see note on contact categories)

### MOUTH AND NOSE PROTECTION

- In Austria, the wearing of close-fitting face masks is mandatory in public buildings and rooms, in all places where crowds of people are gathered and anywhere the distance of 1 m cannot be maintained to others.
- In the event area, the wearing of face masks in the Start, Finish Area and coaches towers is obligatory. It is also compulsory in all gondolas and on chair lifts, including the footpaths between the gondola/lift to the Start Area or from the Finish to the gondola/lift.
- Face masks are not compulsory on skis during sports.
- Wearing a face mask is obligatory in the Organizers offices. The OC-team can be separated from other people by a physical barrier / window (aerosol transmission protection).
- FFP2 masks recommended.

### **HYGIENE**

- Follow the general hygiene measures (avoid hand contact and hugs, disinfect your hands regularly, observe appropriate etiquette when coughing or sneezing (in the crook of your arm!) and wash or disinfect your hands regularly.
- Avoid areas with high volume / loud noises. Do not speak loudly or shout to avoid increased aerosol particle emissions.
- Take responsibility for self-quarantining if any signs of infection are felt.

### LODGINGS / HOSPITALITY

There are national regulations for hotels and restaurants. Please observe the respective measures of hotels and restaurants.

As DH/SG and SL teams are present for the same event, please respect the protective measures for speed teams in Kitzbühel and tech teams in neighbouring villages: do not mix teams and remain in small groups.





Special information for teams will be announced upon arrival at the Team Captains Meeting for DH/SG and SL team hospitality in the event area.

### ARRIVAL / PARKING

Transport with team vehicles is preferred as a shuttle service will not be offered by the Organizer. Use only the allocated and designated parking spaces for the respective teams (DH/SG Hahnenkamm car park, SL Ganslern car park).

### SKI AREA / GONDOLA AND CHAIR LIFTS

The "KitzSki" ski area is expected to be open to the public. Please observe the current safety measures in the skiing area.

The "Parallel Streif" public slope including the Finish Area will be closed to the public in the morning until the end of each training/race. During this time the "Parallel Streif" run is only accessible for accredited persons. The general event area will then open to ski guests in the afternoon.

Special information for teams regarding access to the Hahnenkamm gondola lift (DH/SG) and the Ganslern chairlift (SL) will be provided upon arrival at the Race Office and at the Team Captains Meeting.

### WARM-UP COURSE / LEISURE ACTIVITIES

DH/SG: "Ochsalm" warm-up section. A section of the slope will be fenced off as usual. Please note that all surrounding slopes and lifts (Fleckalm) are open for public use.

To reduce the risk of infection, the Organizer does not offer the use of gyms or fitness facilities In principle, all leisure activities are the responsibility of the teams.

### **POSSIBLE CHANGES**

Based on possible updates of national regulations, local health authorities or internal guidelines, the Organizer reserves the right to make any necessary changes, which will be announced upon arrival.

### ABSTAND/KONTAKTE

- Kleingruppen bilden, keine fremden Kontakte.

### SOCIAL DISTANCE

- Always maintain a distance of at least 1 m between yourself and others.
- Ensure a min. distance of 2 m from contacts for more than 15 min in total (otherwise risk category 1).
- Stay in small groups, avoid contacts outside your bubble.



### MUND-NASEN-SCHUTZMASKE

- Mund und Nase abdeckend, eng anliegend (FFP2 Maske empfohlen).
- Verpflichtend in allen Gebäuden, Start/Zielbereich, Streckenaufbauten, Gondel/Lift, Zu/Abgänge und Personenansammlungen.
- · Nicht beim Ski fahren.

### FACE MASKS

- Mouth and nose covering tightly (FFP2 masks recommended).
- Mandatory in all buildings, start/finish areas, structures, gondolas, chairlifts, accesses and crowds.
- · Not when skiing.



### **HYGIENE**

- Vermeide Umarmungen, Hände schütteln, laute Orte, lautes Sprechen.
- Regelmäßig Hände waschen und desinfizieren, Husten und Niesen in Armbeuge.
- · Räume lüften (stündlich).

### **HYGIENE**

- · Avoid hugs, shaking hands, noisy areas, do not speak loudly.
- Wash and disinfect hands regularly, appropriate etiquette when coughing or sneezing.
- · Ventilate rooms (every hour).



### **ANZEICHEN & AKTION**

- Bei C19 Anzeichen wie Fieber, Husten, Atemnot, Geschmacksverlust sofort Selbstquarantäne.
- Tel. C19 Beauftragte: Lisa Hagsteiner +43 664 173 4419 ansonsten Rennbüro (tagsüber, nur in der Rennwoche) +43 5356 607 100.

### SIGNS & ACTION

- Self-quarantine if you feel any signs of a C19 infection (fever, cough, trouble with breathing, loss of taste).
