



Q&A TEST PROTOCOL & ROUTINES FALUN 29 - 31 JANUARY 2021

Who needs to be tested?

All team members, media, broadcasters, right holders, SRS, FIS officials, timing & data service, volunteers with access to red zone, or with interactions to individuals in red zone, have to be tested. Accreditation will not be confirmed before testing.

Do I need to show a negative PCR test before arrival?

If you do not travel from Lahti "in the bubble" (by chartered plane or by own vehicle) you have to do a PCR test within 72 h before arrival in Falun. The test result should be registered in the FIS Covid-19 passport.

How do I register for tests?

All mentioned in above question (except volunteers), have to register in <u>the FIS Covid-19</u> <u>passport system</u>.

How do I book tests?

Team members and SRSs will be booked according to travel plans in FIS entry system. Team captain and contact person of SRS will have a confirmation om time slot for tests. Please note that teams will have separate time slots from other guests and staff.

Other officials, rightholders, media, broadcasters and suppliers must prebook time slots for test. Send number and name of individuals, request of day and time for test, within the opening hours presented below, to <u>covid19@skidspelen.se</u>, latest 4 days before arrival.





What kind of test will be used in Falun and what does it cost?

LOC Falun are cooperating with a local health company, who will deliver the tests and assist with medical personnel during the testing procedure.

The primary test is an antigen test. Price 369 SEK (approx. 37 Euro).

A second test, if a positive antigen test, is a PCR test from Abbott. Price 2500 SEK (approx. 250 Euro).

When do we need to do test?

LOC Falun strongly recommend you arrive early on-site, since it might take 24h to evaluate a second PCR, if the antigen test is positive.

Where is the test center located?

The test center is located at Lugnet sport center, next to the ski arena.

Address is Lugnetvägen 5.

Due to the ongoing construction at Lugnet for the new swim arena you have to access the test center by turning towards the Scandic Hotel Lugnet the roundabout, pass entrance to the Scandic parking lot and follow signs with World Cup logo that says TEST CENTER.

Entrance to test center is on the backside of the Sport center. Follow signs. Parking is just outside the test center.

Opening hours for test center(no drop in tests):

Tuesday 26 January:	08.00 -12.00 & 16.00 - 20.00
Wednesday 27 January	07.00 -10.00 & 16.00 - 20.00
Thursday 28 January	07.00 -10.00 & 16.00 - 20.00
Friday 29 January	07.00 -10.00 & 16.00 - 20.00
Saturday 30 January	16.00 -20.00 (on call testing 07.00 – 10.00 on request)
Sunday 31 January	On call testing on request 07.00 – 10.00.

What do I need to bring to test center?

You need to bring you passport or valid ID.





What will happen at the test center?

- You will be shown into the test center by a host. Please respect pre booked time slots and have understanding for the circumstances that this is not a normal procedure for everyone involved. We will do our best for making this as efficient as possible. Remember that distance between individuals are highest priority. Keep distance!
- 2. When enter test center wait for your turn to identify yourself and be shown to do the antigen test.
- 3. When the test has been made, you will be shown to sit down, while waiting for the test result. The result will be ready in 15-20 minutes.
- 4. Your name will be called when your result is ready.
- If a negative result, you will receive the test result paper and leave the test center. You are responsible for taking a photo of the test result document and upload it to the FIS Covid-19 passport yourself.
- 6. If the antigen test result is positive, you have to do a PCR-test. Follow instructions by the test personnel.
- 7. On you way out you will pick up your bracelet

How long does it take before getting the result of the PCR test?

Depending on the laboratory load due to the number of tests to be analyzed in Sweden if the infection situation is still high, the test result can take a maximum of 20 hours.

What are the quarantine rules in Sweden if tested positive?

The Swedish authorities says that if you have a positive test of Covid-19, you have to be isolated until you are recovered, at least seven days have passed since you became ill. The last two days must have been without fever and that you otherwise feel healthy. This also applies if you still have occasional, mild symptoms such as a slight cough, runny nose or loss of smell and taste. It is based on the assessment that people with a normal recovery do not infect others with covid-19 after seven days.

There are special routines for severe cases that have been treated in hospital.





LOC are in close contact with regional health authorities and will have assistant from to confirm time for quarantine, depending on the circumstances.

Valid accreditations?

Team members, service industry, FIS officials will use the season bibs, together with the bracelet given out when negative test result, to have access to the arena.

Media, broadcasters, right holders, suppliers and volunteer who has been tested negative, will receive their accreditation card at the test center, with a bracelet that has to be worn during the event to show you are tested.

The bracelet must be visible and shown when passing checkpoints for red zone and zones close to red zone. See accreditation signs at the arena.

If bracelet break, bring to it to race office or media center to change it for a new one. If you lose your bracelet, contact test center for a new one.

Self-assessment every day?

All individuals registered in the FIS passport must make the self-assessment thru the system every day before arriving to the arena. LOC has the right to deny access to the arena if self-assessment is not registered in the FIS passport.
