REGISTRATION:

Online Entry for registration is now available through usasa.org and will close on Friday, January 22, 2021 at midnight. (No on site registration or application is available)

Current USASA and FIS memberships are required for all competitors who wish to enter the FUTURES TOUR competitions.

ALL athletes 18 years and older, adult compliances (SafeSport and Background Screen) must be completed for these memberships prior to registration for the event.

Registration Requirements

Registration will only be available online at www.usasa.org through the regional series hosting the Future Tour competition. (Big Mountain West)

Cost of Registration - \$125.00 per event <https://members.usasa.org/regionals?series=R54>

Competitors are required to have current USASA, US Ski & Snowboard, and FIS membership in order to register. **You will not be able to register online without your active membership for each USASA, US Ski & Snowboard, and FIS**. The minimum age for entry into the contest is 13. All adult members (18 and over) must clear a background screen and pass Safe Sport education protocols **prior to registering** for the event.

Each individual competition discipline must be registered for online separately.

Bib included in registration. Bib pick up location is planned for drive by pick up at UOP/Utah Olympic Park Times for Bib pick up are listed on FUTURES TOUR schedule. Coaches should pick up bibs for their athletes. **Any individuals not traveling with a coach should email kraymer@usasa.org** Bibs will not be turned in / Use for other FUTURES Tour Competition.

***COACHES: Please submit a list of team members you are responsible for so that the Bibs can be grouped for distribution. Email team lists or individuals not traveling with a club/team to: kraymer@usasa.org. Thank you.**

***Registration is required for all COACHES attending the competition (at no cost) but with current membership and coaches credentials - note that the USASA health screen and COVID-19 Test result are both required for all participants.**

Park City Mountain Competition Liability Waiver

***The Mountain Liability Waiver for Vail Resorts must be completed for each athlete, coach, official, staff and volunteer. The waiver needs to be completed on-line and can be found [here](#), and on the Big Mtn West Team App under documents. Vail Resorts/PC Mountain waivers will NOT be collected on site. This waiver is an event waiver and is required regardless if already an Epic passholder.**

Lift Tickets: For practice/competition day/coaches tickets and rate for competitors who do not have an epic pass.

Competitor lift tickets can be purchased for \$40 per day at the First Time Ticket Window at the edge of the parking lot below the Three Kings Terrain Park. The ticket office will have the names of all athletes registered in the competition and you will be able to purchase a multi day lift ticket to get you through the whole competition. Lift tickets for registered coaches will be distributed daily at the lift by an event volunteer.

COVID-19 REQUIREMENTS/FUTURES TOUR PARK CITY

Enhanced COVID-19 Protocols for High Level Competitions

Each credentialed athlete, coach, service technician, official, course worker, and volunteer who may have close contact with other individuals at the competition must have a COVID-19 test within 72 hours prior to beginning of competition for their competition group. Note the 72 hour test sampling period that follows below along with the date-time deadline negative result must be submitted via the google form link provided to each athlete, coach, official and staff member.

Please read the following information carefully. You will be completing two forms for this competition.

#1 - COVID-19 TEST RESULT FORM (Described below in detail)

#2 - A USASA Health Screening is required/following registration you will be notified via email on the steps to complete this form and to submit through USASA.

#1 COVID-19 Testing Requirement

PCR testing should be utilized wherever possible. In the event that PCR testing cannot be performed, or results cannot be generated within the 72 hour timeframe, FDA EUA approved antigen/rapid tests can be utilized as an alternative.

***The COVID-19 Test Result Google Form must be completed for all athletes, coaches, officials. Submit your results via the on-line form.**

The negative COVID-19 test result will include the following information:

- Name of patient
 - Patient date of birth
 - Date/time of sample collection- must be within 72 hrs of the time relating to each competition group.
 - Method of collection (saliva, nasal) and analysis (PCR, antigen)
 - Contact details of the laboratory that performed the test
- If a negative COVID-19 test is not submitted by the required date/time, the individual will be denied a credential/access to the venue.

All athletes / coaches must have completed their COVID Test at the latest by 2:00PM the day before their First Competition. All Results must be submitted/uploaded at the latest by 4:00PM that same day.

Any official, course worker, and volunteer who may have close contact with other participants at the competition must also have a COVID-19 test within 72 hours prior to **the first competition.**

If you have received a positive result, length of time before you can return to play is a period of 15 days from the date of the positive result. The 15 day period does not include time before the test result (symptoms).

The COVID Coordinator for these competitions will manage data to confirm test results for all competitors, coaches and officials prior to the release of the start list for each competition.

*Start of Competition for athletes and coaches is 4PM the Team Captains meeting the day before each competition.

Points:

- Athletes will receive USASA Regional and National Ranking points in your age group and FIS points. The competitions will be scored on an open range and then age group. The FIS result will not reflect age groups. All results will also be scored on the WSPL.
- FIS rules will be followed and USASA rules respected. Finals formats will be determined at the TC meeting prior to the competition.

Rev Tour Qualification

- **Slopestyle**
 - Top 2 Men / 2 Women from each 2021 Futures Tour competitions
 - Athletes will also qualify for the remaining 2021 competitions and 2022 Rev Tour season.
 - Spots will be handed down if an athlete is already qualified from another criteria or is held by an International athlete for the 2021 season only.
 - Handed down spot will not exceed Men's 10th place and Women's 5th place
- **Halfpipe**
 - Top 3 Men / 3 Women from 2021 Futures Tour competitions
 - Athletes will also qualify for the remaining 2021 competitions and 2022 Rev Tour season
 - Spots will be handed down if an athlete is already qualified from another criteria or is held by an International athlete for the 2021 season only.
 - Handed down spot will not exceed Men's 10th place and Women's 5th place



Refunds

- Will not be given except in a medical emergency with a letter from the physician.
- If an athlete fails a health screen 72 hours before the competition a refund will be given
