

## C-19 INFO & RULES FOR ATHLETES & TEAMS



For running the event in the safest possible manner for everyone, we have spared no effort to provide a thorough C-19 safety concept. Following the laws, rules & regulations of the Swiss government & the guidelines from FIS & Swiss Ski, its goal is to protect everyone to the possible max during her/his stay @ the Laax Open 2021. The C-19 Safety Concept has been officially approved by all these three entities.

#### 1. SELF-RESPONSIBILITY

Following the implemented rules is core to the success of any protection system, & we depend on your cooperation. Pls. act accordingly at all times.

#### 2. BUBBLE CONCEPT

There are 4 accreditation groups distiguished: RED Competing athletes & their teams

> **BLUE** Organizing committee & event staff YELLOW Media representatives (all genres)

GREEN Officials, guests & others

All groups are obliged not to mix/mingle with persons from other groups. Consequently, our infrastructure & timings are set up in order to allow all members of the red group to participate in an isolated bubble, with very few exceptions (such as when riding back down to the valley).

### 3. ACCESS TO THE EVENT



All persons from all color who receive accreditation need to go through certain procedures, incl. staying in resp. avoiding certain zones & locations during the event. Pls. refer to the charts in annex A for the red group. They indicate step by step how to procede for:

- Arriving in Laax, checking in & receiving accreditation a)
- b) Going to the mountain for trainings & contests
- Getting back up to the start from the HP finish area c)
- Getting back up to the start from the SS finish area d)
- Going back to the valley/rocksresort after trainings or contests

## 4. DEDICATED AREAS


On both the mountain & in the valley/rocksresort, there are areas/spaces exclusively reserved for the red group. They are not accessible to anyone else & are marked with this sign:



Indicates that this area/zone is restricted to the red group





















## 4. DEDICATED AREAS (cont.)



## Valley/rocksresort:

- Check-In, C-19 Testing Center
- Casa Veglia, restaurant for rocksresort guests from the red group



The accreditation office in HOUSE D (Diva) is not an exclusive Red Zone but has a seperate desk at the back door for accrediting the red group.

Ideally only the team captain shows up here to handled the accreditations for her/his whole team.




## Mountain/Crap Sogn Gion:

- Start Zone HP 1.
- Start Zone SS 2.
- Hangar (your indoor base when on-hill)

On the mountain, the HANGAR is your place to be - a heated & spacious closed building on 2 floors, with daylight, own catering infrastructure, rest rooms & an unmanned camera corner, for giving interviews etc. & with a closed/direct access to the prize giving stage (located on the roof of this facility):


In the HANGAR the teams /nations have their dedicated seatings/tables for catering:















#### 5. THE RED FLAG RULE

At the top of both contest sites Halfpipe & Slopestyle, close to the start zones, there will be flagpoles with red flags, one for each contest.

For course maintenance & other work the restricted red zones, namely start & finish areas, need to be access-ible for our working crews. During these times members of the red group cannot access these zones. This is mainly before you show up onsite or after you've left.

This simply rule communicates to basically everyone onsite whether you/they can access these zones or not.



#### 6. C-19 TESTING

For overseeing & fighting spread, all persons accredited in the red group need to:

- Present a valid negative PCR test that is less than 72h old, at the check-in upon arrival. Pls. make sure you have uploaded your very latest test results on the FIS PASSPORT
- Do an early morning RT-PCR self test (spittle test, not nasal) the day after your arrival & return it to our testing center (again, preferably by TC for the whole group)
- Do a second early morning RT-PCR self test as described above after 3 days
- Do a final RT-PCR test before leaving the event, providing you with a fresh negative test you may need for your next destination

All tests meet the requirements of the Swiss government. With exception of the first PCR test that you need to present upon arrival, all herein mentioned tests are covered by Laax (no costs for tested person).

Pls. note that any form of manipulation, such as spitting into someone else's testing tube, is a criminal offense & is prosecuted by law. It may also result in excluding the whole team from the event, due to the lack of transparency of the handed in tests & their most probable incorrectness.

Upon request we can provide a list of places outside of Laax, where you can get tested (e.g. airport area).

## 7. CONTACT TRACING

As an additional measure for fighting & controlling spread, all accredited persons from all groups shall be individually traced with a personal QR code that is on the badge. This happens namely in the red zones. Security personell will actively do the scanning.

In order to ease things for you & not create queues at entrances, you will receive an armsleeve carrying the same personal QR code as on your pass.

## 8. ONSITE INFORMATION - KEEPING UP TO DATE

Due to the pandemic the daily TC meetings shall be held online only, avoiding the unnecessary gatherings. The link will be given to you with your accreditation.

Pls. make sure you leave your cell phone number at the accreditation for getting on the Laax Open 2021 SMS info service. It allows you to receive first hand information from the contest & event directors, such as delays due to inclement weather, new gondola times for the red group etc., more or less in real time.
