1. COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

The Local Organizing Committee has set up a COVID-19 event task force to minimize risks during the pandemic. The COVID-19 task forces goal is to plan and organize a safe competition for all participants. The COVID-19 protocols for the competitions and health regulations are detailed below. By registering for this event, each team member confirms and accepts the contents of this protocol. Each accredited participant must take personal responsibility to follow the below guidelines and recommendations.

General prevention and mitigation guidelines

- Masks required at all times on and off hill.
- Practice social distancing at all times including chairlift lines, on snow and during competition.
- No participant should travel if they believe they have had close contact* to COVID-19 or exhibited symptoms within 15 days of travel date.
- Wash hands or sanitize often.
- Avoid use of public facilities and transportation when possible.
- Team Captains meetings will be held virtually.





*Close contact: any individual who was within six (6) feet of an infected person for at least 15 minutes (accumulated over any 24 hour period) starting from two (2) days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, two (2) days prior to positive specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.





1. COVID-19 PROTOCOLS- continued

Prior to arrival at competition

- 72 hrs. prior to arrival receive a negative PCR COVID test. Results must be sent to the Event Covid-19 Coordinator prior to accreditation pick up. Details on reporting will be sent by email once you are registered for competitions.
- In case of COVID-19 symptoms do not travel to the venue.
- Avoid stops between the departure point and the event location.

During competition week

- Daily Health Screening Questionnaire. (Begins Day 1- first day onsite)
- Venue access will be limited for coaches and service personal as defined by local State/County health guidelines.
- Athlete bibs and coach armband identification will be required when for venue access.
- All attendees must be accredited to access the venue.
- No spectators.
- Avoid contact with other people especially outside your team.







2. REGISTRATION – DOMESTIC ENTRIES

Domestic US Entries

Prequalified US Athlete Registration

All prequalified US athletes must be pre-registered for each event they plan to compete in. Registration will open on **February 1, 2021**, and all registration & payments will take place online. Registration will close on **February 8, 2021**, no exceptions. After February 8, 2021, unconfirmed spots are considered forfeited.

All athletes MUST designate one single Team Leader (coach) as the onsite contact when registering online. This person will be responsible for onsite registration, COVID-19 compliance, and all communication to/from the LOC during the event. This is extremely important to facilitate the new registration process, accreditation pick-up, and Covid-19 procedures.

2. REGISTRATION – DOMESTIC ENTRIES

US Athlete Alternate List Registration

Domestic US Coach Registration

All Domestic US coaches must register online.

Coaches registration will open on February 9, 2021, and will close on February 27, 2021.

All coaches must have current US Ski & Snowboard & FIS memberships. Renew memberships here.

Please forward this information to any coach on your team that may not have received this email. There will be no on-site coach registration.





2. REGISTRATION - INTERNATIONAL ENTRIES

International Entries

International Entries will be accepted from National Governing Bodies following FIS quotas and rules. Please submit final entries with a FIS Entry Form (ICR Art. 215) to Lyndsay Gang- Lyndsay.gang@usskiandsnowboard.org.

Final entries must be submitted no later than 14 days prior to the first day of official training.

Final Entry Deadline: February 15, 2021

*After submitting the final entry, a link to register online will be emailed. All international athletes must register online and pay entry fees in full by **February 22, 2021.**

Registration Fee- \$125 usd

Spots are not guaranteed if entry fees are not paid.

All international competitors must hold current FIS memberships.







3. ONSITE REGISTRATION/ACCREDITATION

Onsite Registration and Accreditation will be held at Copper Mountain in Center Village.

Registration, accreditation & bib pick-up will be available by appointment only and follow all State/County health guidelines. The Team Leader must schedule a pick-up time. Links to schedule an appointment will be sent directly to Team Leaders following the final entry deadline.

Due to Covid-19 limitations, only one Team Leader will be allowed inside the Race Office at a time, during their scheduled appointment time. Please arrive on time as additional appointments may not be available. If you will be late or need to reschedule your appointment, please contact Lyndsay Gang immediately at Lyndsay.Gang@usskiandsnowboard.org.

Discounted training tickets will be available for athletes. Athletes will receive complimentary lift tickets for all competition days they are registered for.

All Coaches with current US Ski & Snowboard and/or FIS memberships and included within the official team entry will receive complimentary lift tickets for training and competition days.







4. ATHLETE BIBS/COACH ARMBAND

Athlete Bibs

All competitors must wear bibs appropriately during all scheduled trainings and competition. Bibs will be handed out at accreditation. Athletes will use the same bib for both training & competition, and for all 20-21 Rev Tour competitions (Aspen & Copper). Athletes may keep bibs after competitions.

Bibs must be paid for during the online registration process.

Bib fee- \$20

*A \$100 fee will be charged for replacement bibs.

Coach Armbands

All accredited coaches will receive a coach's armband. This will serve as accreditation and access to the venues. Armbands will be issued during onsite registration at the first event you attend and should be used for all 20-21 Rev Tour competitions (Aspen & Copper).

All competitors must have their own medical insurance. The Organizing Committee, sponsors, suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers, the FIS and U.S. Ski and Snowboard decline any responsibility for accidents, damaged or lost equipment and second and third-party claims during the event.

ANTI-DOPING

Anti-doping control may be conducted for this event.
