

COVID-19 GUIDELINES AND RULES OF CONDUCT

GENERAL INFORMATION

Since it's estimated that COVID-19 pandemic wave is going to a peak in Italy in the next weeks, the FIS Alpine Women World Cup in Cortina d'Ampezzo, organized on January 20th-23rd, 2022, must take place under strict safety measures. Based on the current regulations published by the Ministry of Health, the Presidency of the Council of Ministers and the local Prevention Authorities, as well as the additional measures taken by the FIS and FISI (NSA), we present the following catalogue of measures to be observed by all.

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR IN ALL EVENT AREAS

- Health is the highest priority, that's why solidarity and individual responsibility are required, during all your staying in Cortina d'Ampezzo. Always respect anti-COVID-19 measures, limit leisure activities and contacts.
- To take part to the event, teams, LOC staff, media, First Aid members and all those directly involved in the event must prove negative result to COVID-19 test.
- Due to the COVID-19 situation, the number of accredited people will be limited. Turnout at the competition areas will be regulated to avoid interference between groups.

MASK, DISTANCE, AND HYGIENIC RULES

- Always keep the mouth-nose protection mask (FFP2 mandatory) and distance of 1 m. outdoor and not less than 1,5 m. indoor in all event venues, accredited zones, public areas.
- Wash hands very frequently and use hand sanitisers.
- Change masks frequently.
- Hand sanitisers will be available at the venue but always take yours!
- Masks don't need to be worn in the following exceptional circumstances:
 - athletes in the warming-up area or after entering the start corridor;
 - during mealtimes (means only during the time of eating, in all other cases, even to remain seated at the table, the mask must be worn).

JOURNEY TO CORTINA D'AMPEZZO

- Don't travel to the venue with COVID-19 symptoms.
- Teams should avoid contacts with non-team members.
- Media should preferably travel with their own means of transport.



TEAM ACCREDITATION (RED GROUP)

To obtain the accreditation, all teams (both athletes and officials) and red bubble staff must:

- provide a valid Super Green Pass:
 - Administration of two doses of vaccine (three in case of booster), not exceeding 9 months.
 - The complete single-dose vaccination cycle considered "fully vaccinated" according to the regulations of the country of origin, not exceeding 9 months.

The LOC reserves the right to request the original vaccination certificates for those who are not vaccinated with EU-recognized serums.

- The recovery, not exceeding 6 months, certified by the health authority of the country of origin.
- fill out the "whereabouts" and health questionnaire via FIS passport.

You need to provide a negative molecular PRC test result based on oro-naso-pharingeal swab (not sputum). The result of the molecular test must be uploaded on the FIS Passport platform. That's compulsory and test can't be older than 48 hours prior to collect the accreditation in Cortina d'Ampezzo. The withdrawal of the accreditation will be possible from Wednesday, January 19th at 3.00 PM, not before!

Similarly, it's compulsory to **upload on FIS Passport the results of any previous positive molecular test**, to establish the individual's clinical history and calculate the transition time from positivity to negativity.

MEDIA ACCREDITATION (YELLOW GROUP)

To obtain the accreditation, all media must:

- provide a valid Super Green Pass;
- upload a negative Covid-19 molecular PRC test test result on Event Builder platform. The
 test can't be older than 48 hours prior to collect the accreditation. Please note that
 accreditation centre will be open starting from Wednesday, January 19th at 3.00 PM, not
 before!
- Fill in the questionnaire on EventBuilder.
- To get the accreditation, please show the confirmation received via email through the Event Builder system.
- Accreditation is strictly personal and must be always worn.

STAFF, OC MEMBERS AND PROVIDERS ACCREDITATION (BLUE GROUP)

To obtain the accreditation:

- provide a valid Super Green Pass;
- negative Covid-19 test not older than 48hrs before collecting accreditation, organised and scheduled by the LOC.
- Accreditation is strictly personal and must be always worn.



GUESTS AND SPECTATORS (GREEN GROUP)

- Separated access to the following dedicated areas:
 - Guests: maximum capacity of 250 pax hosted in a 1000 sqm outdoor platform;
 - Spectators:
 - max 500 pax (on a max capacity of 1000 pax) hosted in the grandstand all seated and assigned seat;
 - max 500 pax standing in an area with a maximum capacity of 3000 pax.
- To obtain the access to the three dedicated areas, guests and spectators must:
 - Provide a valid Super Green Pass.
 - Show invitation or nominal digital ticket.
 - Wear FFP2 mas and follow safety rules.

Food & beverage services according to the related national protocols.

PRESS CENTRE

- Maximum capacity: 60 people with own desk
- Hand sanitiser will be available, but journalists and media should take extra with them.
- Wearing FFP2 masks is mandatory.
- A catering service will be available, but food must be taken to the personal desk.
- Journalists should limit their movements between the press center and their hotel only.
- Official press conferences at the finish area no press conference at press centre.

MIXED ZONE/MEDIA

- All in-person interviews must be conducted in the mixed zone.
- The mixed zone has proper space-between athletes and journalists. Journalists must be equipped with suitable equipment (e.g., "selfie sticks" or sticks).
- Journalists must wear FFP2 mask.
- All microphones should have a plastic cover over the foam to be replaced after each interview.
 Journalists shouldn't speak into it.

TEAM HOSPITALITY

Teams have their own hospitality at Duca d'Aosta; please do not use any other Restaurants or Refuges, because they are open to the general public.

Avoid any not-necessary contact with guests, fans, media during your stay.

Limit as much as possible the number of people present on site for each team, in particular at the finish area (area 1 and 2)

The access to the race office and team captains meeting is possible for a maximum of 2 people for each team.



HOTEL

- Hotels for teams are booked from the official days of arrival to the official days of departure. In case team members arrive earlier or leave later, please inform the LOC.
- The check-in will be carried out by the team representative for all members.
- all team members must remain in the assigned hotel for the duration of the event.
- Hotels are not exclusive for teams, but proper spaces (in particular for meals and skirooms) will be organized, as well as dedicated flows.
- Compliance with the rules and health concepts will be verified random by the local health authorities.

TRANSPORTATION AND LIFTS

- Teams can use their own vehicles to reach the competition area. The LOC will assign parking passes consistent to the size of the team.
- Media have a dedicated shuttle services, from the press centre to the finish area; private vehicles to reach the finish area are not allowed.
- Separate access lines to the lifts from the general public.

AWARD CEREMONY

- The ceremony is allowed only at the field of play and outdoors.
- No refreshments or other activities are allowed.

IN CASE OF COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

- Immediately contact the LOC. Covid-19 Hotline: +39 389 8968923
- A nasopharyngeal swab will be performed. A positive result will be reported to the local health authorities.
- The positive case will be isolated (an isolation room is available). Declaration of contacts during the past 72 hours will be made.

All people in current contact with the positive test carrier will have to self-isolate/self-quarantine and subsequently undergo a swab test.

FINAL CONSIDERATIONS

- By registering for this event, every team member confirms and accepts the content of this document entirely.
- The organizers will be employed to implement and to control the compliance with the anti-COVID-19 guidelines.
- The LOC reserves the right to exclusion from the event and legal actions in case of non-compliance with these recommendations.



- The LOC reserves the right to perform necessary changes to this document according to the local
 -regional-national evolution of the current situation. The changes will be announced
 immediately.

PCR-molecular tests are available on:

- Friday, January 21st time: 14.30 17.30 (in particular, for those are leaving Cortina on Sunday, 23rd)
- Saturday, January 22nd time: 14.30 17.30 (in particular, for those are reaching Kronplatz WC race scheduled on Tuesday, 25th)

Each reservation needs to indicate:

- name of the organization (i.e. team, broadcaster, media company, FIS, Longines...);
- number of tests requested;
- we'll send you an excel form to fill in with name / surname / date and place-nation of birth / Codice Fiscale (only Italian) or ID card or Passport number / residence / phone number / mail of each person tested.

Result of the tests are guaranteed by 24h.

The cost of each test is 85€. People need to pay cash or credit card at the covid centre; payments after the test (by bank transfer or other options) are not allowed.
