Arriving in France

To enter the country, in addition to VISA regulations, border control measures are temporarily needed, both on entering and leaving the country, depending on the country of origin and vaccination status of the traveler:

- If you are already vaccinated, you must present proof of vaccination status and a sworn statement attesting to the absence of symptoms of covid-19 infection and contact with a confirmed case of covid-19.
- If you are not vaccinated, you must present to the transport company and border control authorities a certificate of recovery older than eleven days and less than six months or a negative PCR or antigen test not older than 72 hours before departure (departure of first flight in the event of a connecting flights).
- Depending on the country of origin and its "health indicator", these regulations may change. The updated lists of countries must be checked on the <u>French Ministry of Foreign Affairs website</u> to know the correct instructions at the time of traveling to France.

The closest airport is Geneva in Switzerland, therefore additionnal <u>visa requirements</u> and <u>Covid-19 regulations</u> may apply for those traveling by plane. Please check the <u>Swiss State Secretariat for Migration website</u> for more information.

Transport

The Organizing committee will arrange transportation between Geneva airport and hotels if requested. 1 transport (from and to the airport) free of charge.

Shuttle service between hotels and competition site will be organized according to the teams request with coaches or minibus.

Accommodation

Booking according to the FIS Rules via FIS Online registration system.

The OC offers accommodation in three star hotels with prices ranging from 106€ (115CHF) to 115€ (125CHF) /pers/night in twin rooms:

- Domaine Mont Saint Jean*** Les Rousses (8km)
- Hotel La Lande *** Le Brassus CH (19km)
- Hotel de Ville *** Le Sentier CH (23km)
- Hotel Le Rocheray *** Le Sentier CH (25km)
- Hotel La Barcarolle **** Nyon CH (27km)

There are also possibilities to offer accommodation at a lesser rate in lower standing hotels or holliday center as well as appartment rentals in the surrounding villages of Les Rousses, Prémanon, Bois d'Amont or Lamoura. Please contact us for such requests at juraskievents@gmail.com.

All hotels and restaurants follow the national regulations from the Ministry of Health concerning Covid-19 which are updated following the evolution of the situation. For booking through the OC, teams will receive the current relevant information and instruction the week prior to their arrival.

Accreditation

Reimbursement & Prize money

Due to data protection rules, all athlete's information have to be directly given to the financial office <u>finances.jse@gmail.com</u> or in the finances office on site.

- Accommodation costs will be paid directly to the OC at the finances office.
- Carrying costs/reimbursement : all payment will be done by bank transfer. Teams must provide the bank information to the OC (finances.jse@gmail.com) with the FIS bank transfer form.
- Prize money: due to French income tax, the gross amount of the prize money will be reduced of 15%. Each athlete is responsible for providing his/her bank information to the OC (finances.jse@gmail.com) with the FIS bank transfer form.

Waxing facilities

Wax cabins available from 10th January 2022 at 14:00.

Keys to the cabin are available at the entrance of the team village. A deposit of 50€ per key is requested.

Teams arriving with waxing trucks have to inform the OC before December 3rd 2021 of their needs.

Medical Service

In case of emergency outside the stadium, public emergency number is 112 (European Emergency number).

At the venue, a doctor is present during the whole competitions at the first aid station, next to the teams compound. The number for this station will be communicated to the teams upon arrival on site.

Health protection plan

Information published in August 2021, subject to changes according to the evolution of the pandemic **please check updated information on our website**

In France you must present a **health pass** to access venues and events, bars, restaurants, malls, hospitals (except if you are admitted for urgent care), and for long-distance travel by plane, train or coach. In accommodation, you will need to present a pass once, on arrival. The health pass is not required for children under 12.

The pass must prove one of the three following items:

- that you are fully vaccinated (with an EMA-approved vaccine or similar): valid 7 days after the second shot for two-shot vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca); 4 weeks after the shot for one-shot vaccines (Johnson & Johnson); 7 days after the shot for vaccines administered to people who have already had COVID-19 (only one dose is necessary).
- or that you have been tested with a negative result within the last 48hrs for antigen tests and within the last 72hrs for PCR; (average costs in France is 55€ for PCR tests and 35€ for antigen tests)
- or that you have recovered from COVID-19, attested by a positive PCR or antigen test result, at least 15 days and no more than 6 months old.

Passes can be digital or in paper form (proof of vaccination or test result) as long as they include a QR code that will be scanned on entry into the venue or event.

The EU Digital COVID Certificate issued from European Union member States, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway, San Marino, Switzerland and the Vatican are valid as health pass.

In any case, the virus does not spread on its own therefore the barrier measures still applies, even if you are vaccinated:

- Respect social distancing: you should remain further than two metres from others;
- Wear a mask where necessary (see below);
- Wash your hands very often or use hydro-alcoholic gel;
- Use single-use tissues, and then throw them away;
- Cough and sneeze into your arm or into a tissue;
- Limit social contacts as much as possible;
- Do not shake hands or greet people with kisses on the cheek;
- Avoid touching your face;
- Air rooms for at least ten minutes, three times a day;

On a general basis, wearing a mask covering your mouth and nose is mandatory in indoor public spaces and on public transport. If you are outside you do not need to wear a mask except in places where social distancing is not possible (queues, railway stations, outside gathering etc.).

You don't need to wear a mask in places where a health pass is required unless indicated otherwise.

What should I do if I am feeling ill?

Common signs of infection include respiratory symptoms, fever, coughing, shortness of breath and breathing difficulties.

If you have a cough or a temperature, stay at home, avoid contact with others and take a test as quickly as possible.

If necessary call a doctor.

If you have difficulty breathing, dial 112.

What should I do if I have the virus?

If you have the virus, you must-self isolate for ten days from the first symptoms. If you still have a temperature, you must self-isolate for a further 48 hours.

If you have the virus but no symptoms, you must self-isolate for ten days from the time you took the test.

What should I do if I have been notified that I am a contact case?

You must self-isolate for 7 days from the last time you were in contact with the person who has the virus, even if you have a negative test result.

If you live with the person who has the virus, you must self-isolate for 17 days. Contact a test centre to make an appointment.

After the test, go straight home and self-isolate until you have the result.

If you are fully vaccinated and have a negative test result, you do not have to self-isolate any further.

Regulations of radio equipment/Radio Frequencies

The use of radio frequencies is regulated by the National Agency for Frequencies (ANFR). Teams must send their request for temporary use of frequencies using the provided Excel file to tempo@anfr.fr (explicative video here).

Regulations of Visa

Citizens of the European Union (Germany, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Romania and Sweden), European Economic Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) or Switzerland do not need a visa to enter the country.

The following countries do not require a visa for visits lasting less than 90 days, but require a valid passport to enter France: Andorra, Antigua and Bermuda, Argentina, Bahamas, Barbados, Bolivia, Bosnia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Korea, Macao, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, Nicaragua, New Zealand,

Panama, Paraguay, Saint Kitts and Nevis, San Marino, Serbia, Seychelles, Singapour, Taiwan, Uruguay and Venezuela.

For citizens of countries not previously mentioned, we recommend visit the France visas website.

Wether needing a visa or not, all individuals entering or leaving the country must comply with the Covid-19 complementary measures and controls. The movement of travellers between France and foreign countries will be done under terms and conditions that will vary according to the health status of these countries and the vaccination status of travellers. Accordingly, countries have been classified based on health indicators ("green", "amber" and "red"). The lists of countries will be updated as the epidemic situation evolves, please check the <u>French Ministry of Foreign Affairs website</u> for the updated lists and corresponding requirements.

Special permissions for truck driving

Most trucks over 7.5 tonnes are banned from the French road and motorway network every weekend between the hours of 10 p.m Saturday and 10 p.m Sunday but there is an exception for trucks servicing sporting events.

Note that trucks are also banned on Sundays in Switzerland, Italy, Luxembourg and Germany (part ban on Saturdays possible in some countries).
