Team service facilities / waxing / dressing rooms / Info center

Address: Suurmäenkatu 4, 15900 Lahti, Finland

Team service facilities are located beneath/next to the HS130 hill close to both team area and Info Center. Each team is provided a waxing cabin with lockable doors in contain¬ers. Info Center will provide keys and information on your waxing facilities.

Team parking is located at the field next to the service area.

During training and competitions, the competitors have to go back to the hill by chair lift.

During competitions the competitors must come to the athletes' lounge without delay after the first round, so that second round can start as scheduled. The jumping order for the second round can be seen at the athletes' lounge. The break between first and final round is about 15 minutes.

During competitions only members of the Jury have access inside the judges tower. For oth-res, entry is strictly prohibited.

There will a snack point at hill area for the teams. No lunch is served at the stadium, because all teams have full board service at Pajulahti.

#### Transportations

Official airport: Helsinki-Vantaa Airport

LOC Lahti will arrange transportation between the airport and the hotel at Pajulahti.

The meeting point of transportation office at the airport is located in the (Terminal 1) T1 Arrivals Hall, 1st floor.

Shuttle bus service is organized for the teams between Pajulahti and Lahti Sport Centre. Buses will drive directly to the service areas.

Shuttle buses will run from 20.3.-25.3.2022. We kindly ask you to use shuttle buses.

Daily timetables with the departures from hotel can be seen in our webpages and the Pajulahti, at the team host office and at the competition office.

If competition is delayed or postponed, the shuttle bus timetable will be adjusted according¬ly. In order to ensure your free bus ride, please, have your accreditation vest/card with you. In all transportation matters please contact the transportation office or team host office.

If there are teams/officials in city center hotels, shuttle service is not available due to close vicinity of the venue (700 meters).

#### Accommodation

All teams will be accommodated at Pajulahti Olympic Training center with full board service. There will be single and double room and in addition for some teams rooms for up to 4 athletes/per one shower.

Pajulahti Olympic Training center is situated 20 kilometers from the venue.

#### Pajulahti has 5 hotels

#### Accreditation

To be accredited, the organisers must have received in advance required information on the person wishing to be accredited. The Accreditation Office first checks the required information.

Courses

Warm up track

Start/Finish Area

Basic instructions for teams to go to the start/finish area: from the service area walk down the hill to the cross-country stadium, thru the tunnel to warm up area.

#### Starting Bibs

The warmup bibs of cross-country events can be picked up in the competition office. On the way to start, athlete changes warm up bib for the starting number bib before transponder installation (installation must be done by the athlete him/herself). The starting number bibs of Nordic Combined skiing are available in competition office (Grandstand Building, ground floor) 30 minutes before the start.

#### Competition courses

Competition courses are marked with banners, ribbons and boards at the crossings. Competition course will be decided later.

#### Weather reports service

Info board for Weather in competition office and service areas will show the air and snow temperature. Measurements are taken at the Stadium and along the course at the highest and lowest points. The measurements are taken every half an hour from two hours before the first competitor starts. The last measurement is taken one hour after the start of the first competitor. Weather service is also available by Whatsapp -group. Leave your number to the service area office.
