Rules

- ▲ FIS Snowboard, Freestyle and Freeski World Championships St. Moritz Engadin 2025 and Swiss Ski are organizing a FIS Freestyle Ski competition, part of the 2022-2023 FIS Freestyle Ski World Cup Tour.
- ▲ The dates for this competition have been published in the FIS Events Calendar.
- ▲ The competition will be held under FIS rules and regulations for freestyle skiing.
- ▲ The competition is comprised of ONE (1) Aerials event, for both women and men.
- ▲ The competition will follow an official program that will be available to all participants.
- ▲ The OC and Swiss Ski, subject to the approval of FIS before the start of the competition and subject to the approval of the jury at the moment of the competition, reserve the right to change the schedule of the events from those published in the program, if necessary.

Entries, Quotas and Important Forms

Entries will be accepted from National Ski Associations following FIS quotas and rules. Please submit the anticipated number of your competition team (including competitors and officials) by **January 24, 2023**, through the online registration system, accessed through the FIS Homepage Member Section.

The final number of your competition team (including competitors and officials) and the names of the participants must be submitted to the organizing committee no later than **February 23, 2023**.

FIS has established Nation Quotas for the World Cup Tour. National Ski Associations can only enter the World Cup ski competitors according to the Quota limitations. [National Quotas](#)

Competitors entered into FIS Freestyle Ski World Cups must have the minimum required FIS Freestyle Ski points in the respective valid FIS points list.

Registration/Accreditation/Ski pass

Team Registration will take place at the Freestyle Workspace (Via dal Farrer 2, CH-7513 Silvaplana) on **Wednesday March 1, 2023, from 12pm to 8 pm**. All fees and deposits must be paid upon registration.

Every athlete and team official are responsible to have the accreditation and ski pass with him/her at any time during training and competition.

Team Captain's Meeting

The Team Captain's Meeting (online) are scheduled as follows:

- ▲ Wednesday March 1, 2023 – 07.00pm to 07.30pm (followed by a Medical Briefing)
- ▲ Saturday March 4, 2023 – 6.00pm to 6.30pm (draw)

Accommodation, Food, Transportation

Accommodation (half-board) and transportation on site will be charged at a maximum of CHF 50 per day per person (FIS Rate) to all competitors and team officials.

Accommodation will be provided for 5 nights, as follows:

- ▲ Arrival on Wednesday, March 1, 2023
- ▲ Departure on Monday, March 6, 2023

Important:

- ▲ Team Captains will pay the FIS Rate for the accommodation and meal program upon arrival at the Freestyle Workspace in Silvaplana.
- ▲ Teams must confirm entries by name and rooming lists for accommodation no later than **Thursday February 23, 2023**.
- ▲ Last minute cancellations or changes to the confirmed rooming list will not be tolerated. At registration, Team Captains will be charged in full (100%) for the dates and number of athletes and officials submitted on the official entry form / team size form as of **Thursday February 23, 2023**.
- ▲ Full Payment for each team member of **50 CHF per day** (for meal program and accommodation) is required at the registration. Any additional officials (defined in World Cup rule #3.3.3.2) and service personnel (defined in World Cup Rule #3.3.3.3) will be charged **70 CHF per day for half board and accommodation**. Teams will be provided with one (1) single room as per World Cup Rule 3.3.7. Any additional single rooms requested will be charged at **100 CHF per day**.
- ▲ Teams or persons who register late (art. 7.6.3 and 7.6.4) have no right to reservation at the FIS rate (art. 3.3.1).
- ▲ All additional charges to the rooms are the responsibility of the Team Captain. No additional charges will be made to or accepted by the OC.
- ▲ At the check-in at the hotel each National Association (Team) will be held responsible for any damage incurred during their stay.

Meals

Breakfast and dinner will be provided, as follows:

- ▲ Beginning with dinner on Wednesday, March 1, 2023, and concluding with breakfast on Monday, March 6, 2023.
- ▲ All meals will be served at the hotel. Details will be confirmed upon check-in at the hotel

Lunch at Finish Area Salastrains

We will serve lunch at the finish house Salastrains for a reasonable price. A small starter, main course and a beverage included. We kindly ask you to inform us until March 1, 2023 about the amount of athletes and coaches (per day) you would like to buy lunch for.

Ground Transportation

Teams are responsible for looking after their own ground transportation. The OC does not provide shuttle services. At the bottom of the gondola Signalbahn will be free parking for teams. Access to the finish area Salastrains will only be by gondola.

High Altitude Training Center St. Moritz

St. Moritz is the official Swiss Olympic «High Altitude Training Base». At 1,856 meters above sea level, the center is located at an ideal altitude for training. Bibs

All competitors must wear bibs during official training, competition, and award ceremonies.

Liability

All athletes, officials and other members of their National Association who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. The Organizing Committee, FIS Snowboard, Freestyle and Freeski World Championships St. Moritz Engadin 2025 and Swiss Ski, sponsors and suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers shall not be held responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by any athlete, official or other person in conjunction with the organisation or staging of the event. All participants are urged not to be negligent in safeguarding their personal belongings at all times. The aforementioned parties will take no responsibility for missing belongings.

Prize Money

All prize money will be issued following the new FIS prize money process. NSAs must manage all information required for prize money using the FIS Athlete Registration module in the FIS member section.

All bank information MUST be uploaded to the FIS database prior to Finals. Athletes without the correct bank information uploaded to the FIS system will experience a delay in prize money bank transfer.

The winners will receive prize money via bank transfer only (no checks). For the Men & Women's FIS World Cup Aerials event, 27'500 CHF will be awarded per gender and for each event. Prize money will be awarded to the top 10 men and top 10 women.

The organizer will use the prize money breakdown according to the FIS world cup rules.

Accident Insurance

Every competitor must have his/her own medical insurance. The OC, Sponsors, Suppliers, Swiss Ski, FIS decline any responsibility for accidents, damaged equipment and second- and third-party claims during the event.

Accident Protocol

In the case of accidents on course during the event, medical personnel from the OC and Ski Patrol staff will be responsible for any medical decisions or evacuation to the local hospital in co-operation with the National Sport Associations' medical staff identified on the entry form.

Anti-Doping Control

Anti-doping control may be conducted for each gender.

Ski Storage / Wax Cabin

The competitors, coaches and officials must store their skis and grooming equipment, as well as wax their skis in the area provided by their respective hotel. **Skis will not be allowed in your hotel room.**
