Arriving in France

Visa regulation

Citizens of the European Union (Germany, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Croatia, Denmark, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, United Kingdom, Czech Republic, Romania and Sweden), European Economic Area (Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) or Switzerland do not need a visa



to enter the country.

The following countries do not require a visa for visits lasting less than 90 days, but require a valid passport to enter France : Andorra, Antigua and Bermuda, Argentina, Bahamas, Barbados, Bolivia, Bosnia, Brunei, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Hong Kong, Israel, Japan, Korea, Macao, Malaysia, Mauritius, Mexico, Monaco, Montenegro, Nicaragua, New Zealand, Panama, Paraguay, Saint Kitts and Nevis, San Marino, Serbia, Seychelles, Singapour, Taiwan, Uruguay and Venezuela.

For citizens of countries not previously mentioned, we recommend visit the France visas website.

Wether needing a visa or not, all individuals entering or leaving the country must comply with the possible Covid-19 complementary measures and controls. At time of publication, no such measures are enforced but that may change as the epidemic situation evolves. Check the <u>French Ministry of Foreign Affairs website</u> for an update of the situation and corresponding requirements.

Transport

Official airport : Geneva

!!! Geneva is in Switzerland, therefore additional<u>visa requirements</u> and Covid-19 regulations may apply for those traveling by plane. Please check the <u>Swiss State Secretariat for Migration website</u> for more information.

The Organizing committee will arrange transportation between Geneva airport and hotels if requested. 1 transport (from and to the airport) free of charge.

Shuttle service between hotels and competition site can be organized according to the teams request.

Special permission for truck driving

- In France most trucks over 7.5 tonnes are banned from the French road and motorway network every weekend between the hours of 10 p.m Saturday and 10 p.m Sunday but there is a permanent exception for trucks servicing sporting events. A confirmation of participation from our OC will be delivered to all teams coming with a waxing truck, accompanied by the French law text granting that exception (arrêté du 16 avril 2021, article 4, part 3°a) as justification in case of a control.
- In Switzerland, driving is prohibited for all vehicles over 3.5t (except the transport of persons), articulated vehicles and road trains of over 5t on Sundays from 00:00 to 24:00 as well as at night from 22:00 to 05:00. - In Italy, driving is prohibited on Sunday from 08:00 to 22:00 for vehicles with an authorized total weight of over 7.5t. Application for derogation must be submitted at least 10 days in advance to the prefecture of the province of departure or of entry into Italy.

Accommodation

Booking according to FIS rules via FIS online entry system.

Due to a lack of hotels in the immediate vicinity of the stadium we offer rooms within 30 minutes drive. Attribution are on a "first come, first serve" basis according to the pre-entry date.

All hotels are of a similar standard, therefore the price is standardized so all teams pay the same price.

Given the program and the distance from the stadium, booking in the hotels is made for half-board and lunch is organized on site for teams accommodated too far to be able to go back and forth. Each team will be notified individually when the accommodation proposition will be sent. Other teams can still request lunch at the stadium if they prefer.

Accreditation

Season accreditations are valid for teams and NSA members. Teams are asked to confirm their needs for event accreditations for their members who don't have a season accreditation.

Accreditations and parking pass for the vehicle are to be picked-up at the race office upon arrival.

Reimbursement & Prize money

All payment will be done by bank transfer.



FIS Nordic Combined World Cup Chaux-Neuve (FRA) 20.01.2023 - 22.01.2023

The financial office is situated at the jumping hill, on the first floor of the rotunda. Opening times on Friday after the training, Saturday morning before the ski jumping competition and after the cross-country race.

Accommodation costs will be paid directly to the OC at the finances office.

Travel costs/reimbursement : teams will be presented with an invoice summarizing the accommodation costs, quotas reimbursements and travel money. In case of reimbursement, teams must provide their bank information to the OC through the FIS form. Prize money : each athlete is responsible for providing his/her bank information to the OC through the FIS.

Waxing facilities

Wax cabins are available from 17th January 2023 at 14:00. A deposit of 50€ per key is requested.

Teams arriving with waxing trucks have to inform the OC before December 5th 2022 of their needs.

Medical Service

In case of emergency outside the stadium, public emergency number is 112 (European Emergency number).

At the venue, a doctor is present during the whole competitions at the first aid station, next to the teams compound. The number for this station will be communicated to the teams upon arrival on site.

Health protection plan & Testing protocol by LOC or host country

Information subject to changes according to the evolution of the pandemic : please check updated information on our website.

At time of publication, no Covid-19 passes, testing or specific measures are enforced beyond those relating to general safety. Viruses (Covid or others) do not spread on their own therefore the barrier measures are still strongly encouraged:

- · Respect social distancing: you should remain further than two meters from others;
- Wear a mask where necessary (see below);
- Wash your hands very often or use hydro-alcoholic gel;
- Use single-use tissues, and then throw them away;
- · Cough and sneeze into your arm or into a tissue;
- · Limit social contacts as much as possible;
- Do not shake hands or greet people with kisses on the cheek;
- Avoid touching your face;
- · Air rooms for at least ten minutes, three times a day;

Testing protocol will be confirmed if applicable 15 days prior to the beginning of the competition.

Regulations of radio equipment/Radio Frequencies

The use of radio frequencies is regulated by the National Agency for Frequencies (ANFR). Teams must request temporary authorization with this <u>Excel file</u> to be sent to <u>tempo@anfr.fr</u> at the latest January 6th 2023.
