Accommodations, Transportation & Parking

Accommodations

Mogul and aerial athletes and officials will be provided accommodations at various hotels in Park City, between downtown and Kimball Junction. Breakfast and dinner will be provided at your lodging, excluding competition nights.

By November 15, 2023 - Please email events@usskiandsnowboard.org to confirm using team lodging. Official team lists are not required at this time, just your intention of using the lodging provided.

Teams are going to receive invoices on January 23, 2024.

Payment needs to be received by January 26, 2024.

Teams are financially accountable for all changes/drops made after January 23, 2024.

Any drops made after this date will be charged back to the teams.

All teams MUST identify a single team leader as the onsite contact when submitting team entry. This person will be responsible for communication to/from the OC prior to and during the event. This is extremely important to facilitate the registration process and accreditation pick-up.

Event Registration & Accreditation

Prior to Arrival

1. All Team entries must be submitted prior to the deadlines listed above. The team leader is responsible for all communication to / from the OC and submission of all documentation and waivers
2. Submission of completed Event Liability waivers and accreditation requests

1. Passport
2. Visa or ESTA

Prize Money

All prize money will be issued following the new FIS prize money process. NSAs must manage all information required for prize money using the FIS Athlete Registration module in the FIS member section. All bank information MUST be uploaded to the FIS database prior to Finals. Athletes without the correct bank information uploaded to the FIS system will experience a delay in prize money bank transfer.

The winners will receive prize money via bank transfer only (no checks). In order to process the prize money, all winners must provide valid bank details, identification, and complete appropriate tax documentation (see link below).
