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1. REGISTRATION - ENTRIES





Team Entries are only accepted using the FIS Online Entry System. NGBs can access the online system through the "Member Section" of the FIS homepage.

Provisional Entry: October 14, 2023
Final Entry: December 3, 2023

TEAM LEADER:

All teams **MUST** identify a single team leader as the onsite contact when submitting team entry through the FIS system. Please distinguish this person as the "On Venue Contact" and include on-site phone and email information. This person will be responsible for all communication to/from the LOC prior to and during the event.

MEMBERSHIP:

All competitors must hold current FIS and other applicable memberships.







2. EVENT REGISTRATION/ACCREDITATION





PRIOR TO ARRIVAL:

All Team entries must be submitted prior to the deadlines listed above. Team Leaders are responsible for all payment & communication to/from the OC and submission of all documentation and waivers. Document and waiver links will be sent to Team Leader after the final deadline.

Please ensure that all athletes, coaches, and service staff, whose accreditation the Team Leader is responsible for picking up, have completed the following tasks:

- Competition Liability Waiver signed and submitted
 - *Any participant under 18 years old will need a parent/guardian to sign their waiver*
- Athlete Bio (*Athletes only*)

Accreditation will not be issued if all above forms have not been completed. There are a limited number of appointments available, and additional appointments may not be available.







2. EVENT REGISTRATION/ACCREDITATION (CONTINUED)





ONSITE ACCREDITATION:

Registration and accreditation pick-up will be available by appointment only. The Event Registration Manager will schedule one appointment for the Team Leader to pick up accreditation for the entire team, including all service staff. At this time, they will receive all credentials, lift tickets, and athlete bibs. Only one Team Leader will be allowed inside the Race Office at a time, during their scheduled appointment time.

Accreditation appointment times will be emailed directly to Team Leaders following the Final Entry Deadline.

Registration and accreditation will be held at the Copper Mountain Conference Center (209 Ten Mile Circle, Copper Mountain, CO 80433). All participation fees will be collected upon check-in.

Athlete Participation Fee: 80 CHF

Please arrive on time as additional appointments may not be available. If you will be late or need to reschedule your appointment, please contact Erin McNeely.







3. INBOUND TRAVEL





Please note that consular processing is still limited at most US consular posts, and scheduling appointments remains a challenge. It remains critical that international travelers with events in the U.S. apply as early as possible. The State Dept. recommends individuals apply at least 90-120 days in advance of travel.

At this time, foreign nationals entering the US will be required to present the following for entry:

- 1. Passport
- 2. Visa or ESTA
- 3. Please refer to the CDC guidelines for updated U.S. travel requirements regarding Covid-19.

ACCOMODATIONS

The Local Organizing Committee will not be able to offer the FIS accommodation package. Below is info for discounted lodging rates.

TRANSPORTATION

Teams are responsible for their own transportation.

PARKING

Parking will be provided for use in designated areas at Copper throughout the event. More information about parking will be distributed to the Team Leader prior to the event.







5. BIBS/AWARD CEREMONIES





BIBS

All competitors must wear bibs appropriately during all scheduled trainings, competition and at the awards ceremony. Bibs will be picked up by the Team Leader at accreditation pick-up.

AWARD CEREMONIES

The award ceremony will be held immediately following finals in the Venue Finish Areas. To receive prize money, all competitors must attend and wear bibs during award ceremony.









6. TEAM APP/ TEAM CAPTAINS MEETINGS





TEAM APP

All event communications and the most current information leading up to and during the event will be posted on Team App. This will be the place to find details regarding schedule updates, start lists, results, Covid-19 resources, and more.

"Team App Instructions" for joining the correct team and turning notifications on will be sent to Team Leaders following the Final Entry Deadline.

TEAM CAPTAINS MEETINGS

The first Team Captain's meeting will be held virtually. Other meeting links and details will be sent out the the Team Leaders prior to each meeting.

7. PRIZES



All prize money will be issued following the new FIS prize money process. NSAs must manage all information required for prize money using the FIS Athlete Registration module in the FIS member section. All bank information MUST be uploaded to the FIS database **prior to Finals**. Athletes without the correct bank information uploaded to the FIS system will experience a delay in prize money bank transfer.

The winners will receive prize money via bank transfer only (no checks). In order to process the prize money, all winners must provide valid bank details, identification, and complete appropriate tax documentation (see link below).

A total prize purse of 60,000 CHF will be awarded for each Men & Women's FIS World Cup Halfpipe & Big Air event. 30,000 CHF will be awarded per gender, for each event. Prize money will be awarded to the top 10 men and top 10 women.

8. MEDICAL PLAN/ANTI-DOPING






MEDICAL PLAN

LIABILITY

The Organizing Committee, sponsors, suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers, the FIS and U.S. Ski and Snowboard shall not be responsible for any losses or injuries incurred or suffered by any athlete, official or other person in conjunction with the organizing and staging of the event.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

All competitors must have their own medical insurance. The Organizing Committee, sponsors, suppliers, their agents, employees and volunteers, the FIS and U.S. Ski and Snowboard decline any responsibility for accidents, damaged or lost equipment and second and third party claims during the event.







10. ATHLETE SAFETY



U.S. Ski & Snowboard works to provide a safe environment in which athletes can train and compete, free from abuse and inappropriate behavior.
