

COVID-19 Team information for tests and test protocols As of 03.11.2020

With this letter we would like to inform all teams again about the **COVID-19 tests** and **COVID-19 test results** for the **FIS Freeski Weltcup Stubai 2020**.

- Each team member officially named by the respective National Ski Federation via the FIS online system is obliged to present a negative **PCR test** not older than **max. 72 hours** (max. 72h between taking the sample/smear and collecting the accreditation).
- Presentation of a positive COVID-19 antibody test **is not recognised**. Persons who present a positive PCR test between 3 months and 2 weeks prior to arrival do not need a new PCR test. **Persons with a positive PCR test within 2 weeks prior to arrival cannot participate in the event.**
- **Testing outside Austria:** The PCR test presented must be recognised by the health authorities in the country where the test is carried out! For this purpose, the following information of the laboratory must be sent to s.kaltenbrunner@wintersport-tirol.at after testing:
 - Name of the laboratory
 - Address of the laboratory
 - Homepage and e-mail address of the laboratory

It is not necessary to send the laboratory data for approval in advance!

- **Testing within Austria:** The PCR test presented must be approved by the Austrian health authority! The following laboratories are approved:
 - **Laboratory Novogenia in Salzburg/Eugendorf:** Tests can be ordered online under the following link: <https://shop.novogenia.com/kategorie/novo-immune> . With the voucher code "ski2020" there is a discount of 20%. Please allow for delivery time/delays when ordering (currently up to 3 days by post within Austria!).
 - **Mobile LAB Truck:** PCR tests are generally preferred before arrival. Should there be any problems with external PCR tests, the mobile laboratory (LAB) truck is available. The Mobile LAB Truck quickly delivers certified PCR tests. Teams can register for the tests online at digital.test-mobil.com . **The LAB truck is in Innsbruck 7 days a week from 13.00 to 17.00 hrs. Costs per single test EUR 85,-. For further information please call the LAB Truck Hotline +43 720 906700 60 or service@test-mobil.com.**
 - **Laboratory SINSOMA in Innsbruck:** Certified PCR tests can be carried out directly with Mrs. Corinna Wallinger corinna.wallinger@sinsoma.com by prior appointment
- For all PCR tests, the time of sample collection must be indicated.
- The LOC reserves the right to order a new test in the LAB truck in case of unclear PCR tests.
- For countries with current travel warnings for entering Austria, you can find information on the homepage of the Foreign Ministry <https://www.bmeia.gv.at> or the Austrian Embassy in your respective country.

- The COVID-19 test protocol of **each individual team member** must be submitted via the following link **no later than 12 hours** before the accreditation is picked up

Test results must be sent to the LOC either collected per team or individually per person via the link above. IMPORTANT: It is sufficient if a list of negative tested persons is sent with the laboratory confirmation. It is therefore no longer necessary to send individual original test results. If it is not possible to send a laboratory confirmation with the names of the persons tested, it must be ensured that a separate test protocol is available for each person tested (also for pool tests).

- **Single Point of Contact (SPOC) with the number +43 664 815 2990 is manned around the clock from Tuesday to Sunday. If anyone from the team feels unwell, please contact us immediately.**
- **Corona Suspect Case Management:** In case of suspected COVID-19, the SPOC must be contacted. A team of the Austrian Red Cross is available on site to handle further procedures with isolation and contact to the authorities (Bezirkshauptmannschaft Imst and Bezirkshauptmannschaft Innsbruck-Land). Appropriate premises are available for any necessary isolation. In case of a positive test result, the authority decides on possible quarantine of further persons in the surrounding area (e.g. team members).
- Likewise, each team member has to fill in the health questionnaire prescribed by the FIS and bring it to the event shortly before arrival (see appendix 1).
- **Training and competition protocol**

Before each training and competition, a training and competition protocol as per Appendix 2 must be submitted to the LOC by each team, in which the state of health of the individual team members is documented.
- **ATTENTION: Due to the long stay of the teams in the Stubai, each team member has to carry out an Anti Gen quick test on Wednesday, 18.11.2020. The LOC will set up a test road for Wednesday, 18.11.2020 afternoon. More detailed information will be given at the team captain meeting on Tuesday before the event.**
