Quotas

The quotas for the NorAm Cup Tour for HP/SS/BA events are as follows:

Host Nation	Up to remaining total field size	Up to remaining total field size
Foreign Nations	20 – Max of 8 per nation, with a max of 5 per gender	
Totals	Max field size determined by each event	

In addition, the top 16 competitors in the current FIS points list (each event) will receive a personal spot.



BIBS

- Competitors must wear their bib (in a visible manner) at all times on the competition site. This includes during official training sessions, course inspection, the competition and the medal ceremony.
- The competitor is responsible to keep the bib in a reasonable condition and return it to the LOC when specified.
- 40\$ cash deposit is required to have bib. Will be returned when bib is received in a reasonable condition.
*Resort may not have an ATM to withdraw cash

ACCIDENT PROTOCOL

In the case of accidents on courses during the event, medical personnel from the Organizing Committee and Ski Patrol personnel will be responsible for any medical decision or evacuation to the local hospital in cooperation with the National Associations' medical personnel identified on the entry form.

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN

Copies of the Event Medical Plan will be available at the Race Office or upon request.



LIABILITY AND ACCIDENT INSURANCE

All athletes, officials and other members of the regions who attend and participate in the event shall do so at their own risk. Every competitor is required to have his/her own medical and life insurance that is adequate and covers the maneuvers being performed in training and competition. All athletes, coaches and officials must have a valid membership. The organizing committee, the P/TSO, Freestyle Canada, the resort and the Canadian Snowsports Association shall not be responsible for accidents, damaged or lost equipment and belongings and/or second- or third-party claims during the staging of the event. All participants are urged to always protect and safeguard their personal belongings.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Please note that there will be **ZERO TOLERANCE** for any offensive language or behaviour during the event. Any damages or disruption to hotel, facilities or other property related to this event will result in the offender(s) being immediately removed from the event.

LICENSES

- Athletes are required to have a valid FIS number and be approved by their NSO
- Canadian Coaches, Officials and volunteers are required to have a valid FC license and all of the requirements related to its validation
- All athletes, coaches, officials and volunteers must register for the event
