1. REGISTRATION & ENTRIES

International Entries

International Entries will be accepted from National Governing Bodies following FIS quotas and rules. Please submit final entries with a FIS Entry Form (ICR Art. 215) to Erin McNeely - erin.mcneely@uskiandsnowboard.org.

Final entries must be submitted no later than 14 days prior to the first day of official training.

Preliminary Entry Deadline: **February 23, 2026**

Final Entry Deadline: **March 9, 2026**

*After submitting the final entry, a link to register online will be emailed. All international athletes must register online and pay entry fees in full by **March 11, 2026**.

Registration Fee: \$175 USD per start

Spots are not guaranteed if entry fees are not paid.

All international competitors must hold current FIS memberships.

2. ONSITE REGISTRATION/ACCREDITATION

Onsite Registration and Accreditation will be held at Buttermilk Mountain, Aspen Colorado.

Discounted training tickets will be available for athletes to purchase on-site.

Athletes will receive complimentary lift tickets for all competition days they are registered for.

All Coaches with current US Ski & Snowboard and/or FIS memberships and included within the official team entry will receive complimentary lift tickets for training and competition days.

3. ATHLETE BIBS

Athlete Bibs

All competitors must wear bibs appropriately during all scheduled trainings and competition. Bibs will be handed out at accreditation. Athletes will use the same bib for both training & competition, and for all 2026 Rev Tour competitions (Copper, Aspen, and Mammoth). Athletes may keep bibs after competitions.

Bibs must be paid for during the online registration process.

Bib fee: \$20

**A \$100 fee will be charged for replacement bibs.*
